The Trento Proton Radius Puzzle Workshop was a very successful meeting of 40 people involved in the Puzzle, a large fraction of the world's community of active researchers in this area, representing many theoretical and every significant experimental effort to resolve the puzzle. It was held at Trento, Italy from June 20-24.

Workshop attendance was nearly half from the U.S., including 4 graduate students and one postdoc. The JSA money specifically supported Ashot Gasparian, who present the PRAD experiment at Jefferson Lab, and Carl Carlson, who has been widely active in theory related to the Puzzle. The Workshop was also supported by funds from Trento, MPQ Garching, and Rutgers, in addition to research group travel budgets.
